Greetings from your Vice Presidents:

Hello Grovenor!!

We sincerely hope that everyone is safe and healthy. With the recent announcements by the **Alberta government** regarding the **three-stage reopening plan**, Grovenor Community League's

Board of Directors will consider the new guidelines and projected timelines when we are reviewing the potential of offering community programs in a safe manner later in 2021. The government's reopening plan allows for eased restrictions by late June or early July, if and when certain milestones are achieved.

From the time of the initial declaration of the Covid 19 pandemic, our Board has acted responsibly in following all required guidelines, public health restrictions and related advice issued by governments at the local, provincial and federal levels. We will continue to monitor any new updated safety guidelines issued by Alberta Health Services, City of Edmonton and the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues and to try our best to host any events that are deemed feasible for Grovenor in the future, entirely based on related health risks and our ability to comply with all required guidelines. Unfortunately, due to the current mandated AHS health regulations and protocols, we are not yet able to provide definitive guidance at this time on if and when we will be able to offer any of our regular **programs and activities in 2021**. We will continue to post appropriate updates in a timely manner on our social media, website and community hall sign.

Thanks to all of our hard working **Board members** and the many community volunteers who sacrifice their time and energy to organize and manage the many programs that make this such a great community to live in!

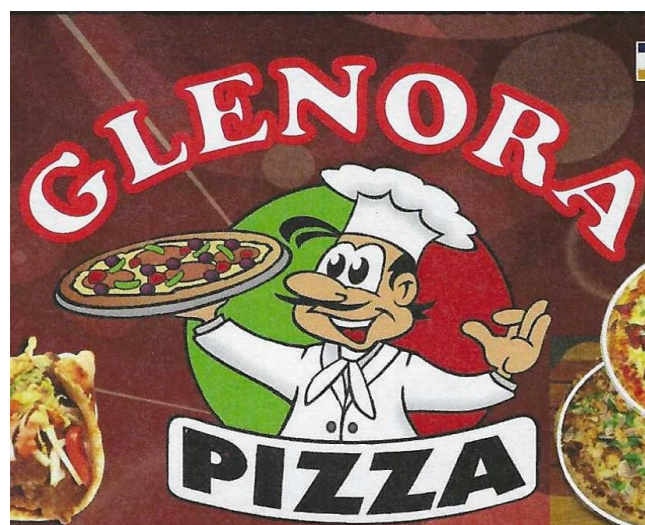

“ To Sled, or not to sled...”

In response to a request by our Board and numerous residents of Grovenor regarding the enhancement of the existing hill in Grovenor Park into a “sledding hill”, the following response was received:

The project proposal assessment review conducted by the City Park and Facility Development team have recommended that this project does not go further into park development. The following reasons are listed underneath that an increased sliding hill at Grovenor park is not being recommended. Edmonton School Board was consulted on the project proposal as land ownership with the sliding hill goes between City owned and School Board owned land.

- Roughly half of the current hill is on Edmonton Public School Board Land and the remaining half is on city owned parkland. The current hill was not designed as a sliding hill. There is not enough room on site to safely enlarge the hill.
- Currently the Edmonton School Board does not support this proposed project and has cited supervision, safety and maintenance as their main concerns.
- safety - with the current design of the park any changes to the height of the hill could cause safety issues for children. The only safe direction to slide would be south towards the open space however the design would be such that if a child slide to the north or west they could hit an obstacle and be injured.
- sightlines when the students are outside during recess and before/after school.
- the staff at the school is limited and would not be able to add additional staff to supervision.
- a larger hill would require helmets. Requiring helmets would be difficult for the school to manage and could create inequality of access to the hill.
- the school expressed concern about maintenance of the existing hill that it gets extremely icy in the winter months and the school often has to close the hill to avoid injury

Unfortunately, the size of Grovenor park will not allow a larger sliding hill to be placed in the community.

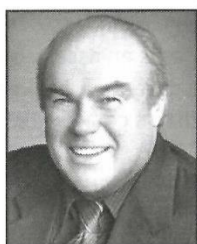

How safe is Grovenor?
