It was a very interesting and informative meeting with a wide variety of topics discussed some of which included Snow Removal concerns, 148 Street Bridge closure, Infill projects and related issues, Valley Line LRT project, Coronation Rec Centre, CoE Urban Planning Committee, Traffic Safety Measures for Grovenor, Street Labs, Crosswalk Lighting at Stony Plain Road & 148 Street, etc.

The Community of Grovenor began way back in 1907 when a solitary home was built on the north bank of the McKinnon Ravine. A colourful and storied history notwithstanding, it was not incorporated as a Community League until 1952. We are a quiet, family friendly neighbourhood with beautiful, tree lined boulevards. The community includes an award-winning school and an active community league. It is bordered by the beautiful McKinnon Ravine and the North Saskatchewan River trail system.

SO, YOU WANT TO IMPROVE YOUR YARD?

Spring is just around the corner, or at least it feels that way with these warm spells that are causing all sorts of grief. Water flows and then it freezes and flows and freezes. It might have more than a few people noticing that the ground around their homes is not shedding water in the proper direction. You might be noticing ice buildup in places that are not safe or wanted. This is an indicator that your property is no longer meeting City Lot Drainage guidelines, and this will need to be addressed for your own peace of mind, safety, and home insurance requirements.

You might also be looking forward to a new year of backyard gatherings and BBQ events with friends and thinking that this is the year to get the yard of your dreams. Planning for this cannot start too soon as the contractors that perform this work, and the materials they use, will soon be in short supply. Permits for this work can also take a long time to secure, so even if it is work you intend to do yourself, it is best to get working on the documentation you will need.



The City of Edmonton is going to require a permit for many improvements to your property and these are best secured prior to the work. Regulations and allowances change over time, so what may be allowable now, might not be in 10 years when you go to sell the property and that could result in having to demolish or modify the work in the future if you did not secure a permit for it in the present.

Check with the City website about the requirements for your project type. Permits can require professional survey information and or prepared drawings, so check early as to what is expected. Permits can also take months to get approved, so start early.

USING A CONTRACTOR

As with any service provider YOU must verify that what they are offering is going to meet the needs of the regulator. Even if the city requires an inspection, this is not a guarantee on the service provider, nor a “hammer” that you can swing if you are unhappy. You as the Owner, must communicate very explicitly as to what your expectations are with regards to every aspect of the project. You as the client must get in writing:

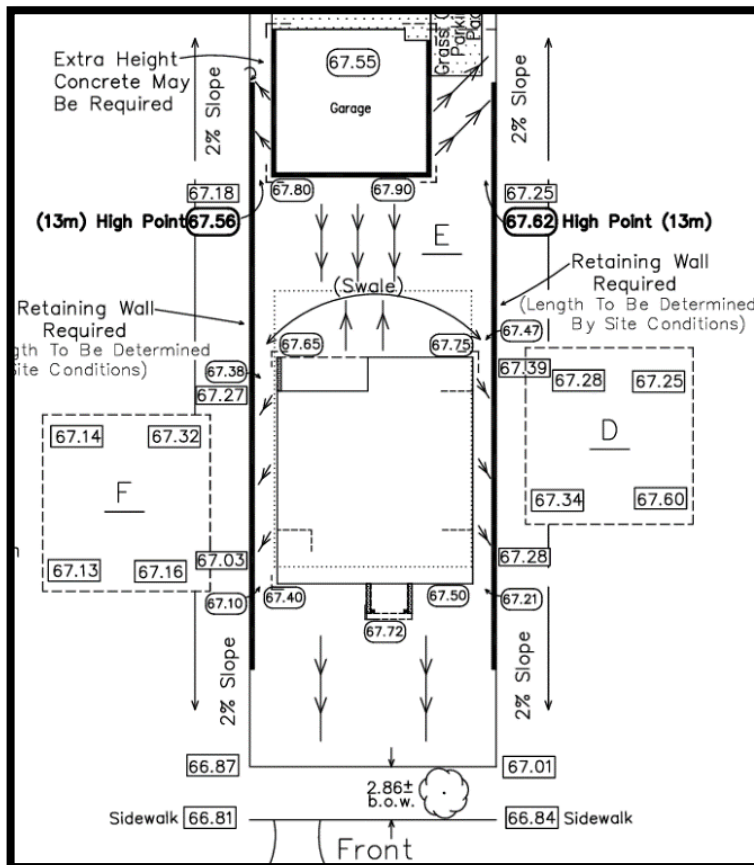
- what you expect to have completed,
- to what level of quality or performance,
- who will have the final say on the quality of materials or work,
- on what timeline,
- for a specified cost, labor and materials should be listed in detail, one lump sum is tricky
- and what will happen in the event of weather or material delay, or cost overrun.

Having drawings made up that diagram the work, the materials, and the outcome is often part of the contract, and all parties should agree to and sign those documents as well.

You should always interview and receive quotations from at least three contractors of similar qualifications. You should also insist on a list of references, including at least one recent (in the last year) project that they have completed. You should go to see the work (difficult now I admit) if at all possible. Anyone who uses high pressure tactics to get you to secure an “early-bird” deal or lock in material prices are to be considered suspect. Nothing is stopping you from buying the material, usually from the same supplier, and having it in hand. This is often worth the possible added costs so that you can have some control on that aspect of the work.

DIY OPTION

Many people have the interest to do landscaping work themselves. The skills are not overly hard to develop, and the materials are usually forgiving. Increasingly online resources provide step-by-step guides and big box retailers will rent most any tools and equipment (not that I advise just anyone to start using a skid-steer loader). This YOU-CAN-DO-IT attitude has resulted in many a sore back, sunburn, or strained relationship with your friend who has a truck. Make sure to really consider the scope of what you are doing and to think about the physical toll that landscape work can entail. Even a small project will result in actual tons of materials that need to be shifted, often by hand, in summer heat.



Many yard improvement projects do require the services of a Alberta Land surveyor to locate your property lines and or the existing elevations of the property (this indicates the “lay of the land” and where water will flow or pool). These surveys can be costly, they must happen when the ground is visible (not under snow). Book early to avoid disappointment in the busy summer season.

For minor projects or improvements, you can look to the Real Property Report included in the purchase of your property. From that report you can make decisions about where to locate a deck or a small shed to make sure you are on your property.

THINK BIG PICTURE

Make sure that the project you are considering is not going to make an existing condition worse or hide it. Building a new deck over ground that slopes towards your house is hiding a flood risk. Adding a new concrete patio might result in a very icy backyard space with the winter warm spells. Consider the impacts of

your completed project through all the seasons as new materials and structures will impact how you interact with your yard. Also consider and talk with service providers and your neighbors as to what the expected impacts during construction will look like: yard access, yard use, materials or dumpsters stored on driveways or front street, damage to existing finishes (house, yard, fence, public property) during the work, noise, vibrations, increased traffic/parking issues. Forewarning and a BBQ in the new space can mend many a frayed nerve.

B165 Mackinnon Ravine Pedestrian Bridge Demolition

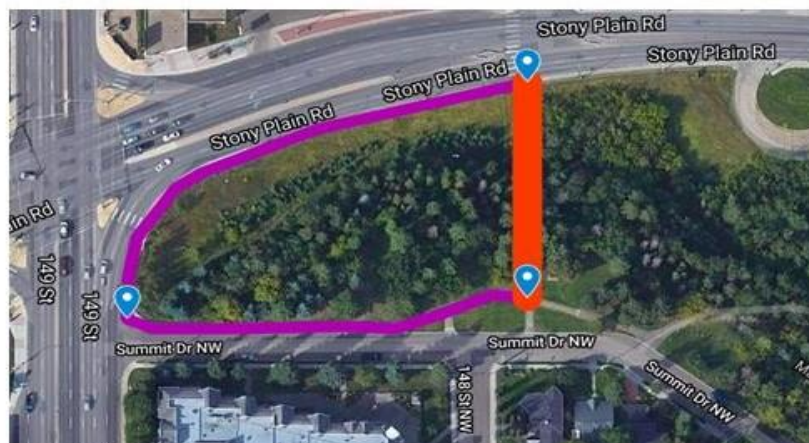
Greetings,

The City of Edmonton will be undergoing work in your area which involves the demolition of Mackinnon Ravine Pedestrian Bridge (B165), located at 149 Street & Summit Drive and 148 Street & Stony Plain Road. Construction activities are scheduled to begin in mid-February and are anticipated to be completed by early March.

Project Overview

The Mackinnon Ravine Pedestrian Bridge (B165) was closed in September 2021 due to insufficient capacity to support pedestrians and snow removal equipment. Demolition was recommended and is now scheduled for mid-February. Additional alternative path options will be explored in 2022.

The wooded area below the bridge is barricaded and regular checks are done to ensure the continued safety of Edmontonians. An easily-accessible detour to the river valley trail and Summit Drive remains via 149 Street NW.

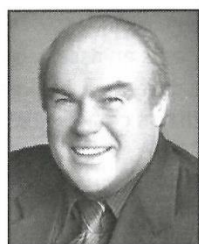

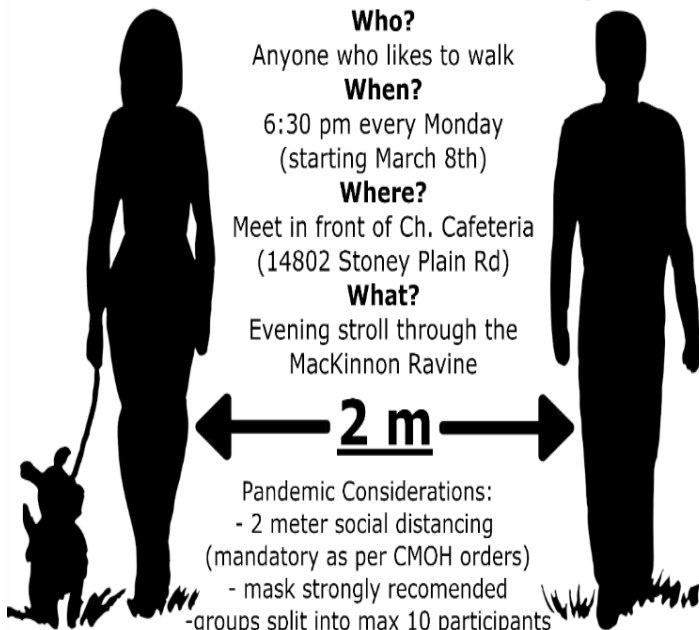
